Turn onto June Washam Road in Davidson, curve around the cornfield. Turn onto Reinsch Road, pass through the construction zone. Turn onto Shearer Road and keep driving—you will notice a bright pink electrical box on your left. It's a shock of color next to a labyrinthine, cinder-block foundation, the hint of one more house being constructed in Davidson's River Run community.

Matthew Gibson of Gibson's Electrical & Lighting normally paints his electrical boxes fire-engine red. But he painted this one with a pop of pink—the

signature color for breast cancer awareness. He wanted to surprise his wife Tabitha, who was diagnosed with breast cancer eight years ago and is now cancer-free. Gibson commented: "She was pretty ecstatic about it."
